CELEBRATION OF NATIONAL PRODUCTIVITY WEEK – 2017 BY HFRI, SHIMLA

Himalayan Forest Research Institute, Shimla celebrated National Productivity Week from 12th to 18th February 2017. The theme for this year is, "From waste to profits through Reduce, Recycle and Reuse."





Shri Pradeep Bhardwaj, DCF Extension Officer, HFRI gave a detailed presentation on the theme, "From waste to profits through Reduce, Recycle and Reuse." Highlighting the issue of reduction in use and re-use of certain items at home, workplace and garden etc., he said that recyclable materials include many kinds of glass, paper, cardboard, metal, and electronic plastic, textiles items.

Materials to be recycled are either brought to a collection centre or picked up from the curbside, then sorted, cleaned, and reprocessed into new materials destined for manufacturing. In the sense, recycling of a material would produce a fresh supply of the same material, for example, used office paper would be converted into new paper or used polystyrene foam into new polystyrene. He stressed that it is the need of the hour to follow the theme, "From Waste to Profits through Reduce, Recycle, Reuse," in its true letter and spirit.

Dr. V.P. Tewari, Director, HFRI, Shimla said that instead of generic

suggestions, specific efforts required to enhance productivity in few priority sectors need to be undertaken. Highlighting the issue of recycling, he said that **Recycling** is the process of converting waste materials into new materials and objects. It is an alternative to "conventional" waste disposal that can save material and help lower greenhouse gas emissions. Recycling can prevent the waste of potentially useful materials and reduce the consumption of



fresh raw materials, thereby reducing: energy usage, air pollution and water pollution. Recycling is a key component of modern waste reduction and is the third component of the "Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle" waste hierarchy. He emphasized that HFRI should promote the theme in real sense and the scientific community can play a vital role in sensitizing the issue amongst the general public in a more effective and scientific way.
